TASK:

- 1. You are required to collate a media file containing 4 articles relating to the following:
 - Equality
 - Fairness
 - Justice
 - Rule of Law
 - Court decisions
 - Statute law
 - Enforcement agencies eg Police
- 2. One article per issue must be selected. Your media file must show articles from four of the above issues. Ensure you select Australian articles featuring the Australian legal system.
- 3. For each article you are required to include the source, date and headline of the article as well as a short, clear argument (200 words) addressing whether the article demonstrates the effectiveness or ineffectiveness of the legal system. Reasons must be provided to support your statements.
- In order to create an effective argument, credible research sources must be utilised and referenced within your argument and a bibliography provided. A list of suggested sources is provided with this task.

REQUIREMENTS CHECKLIST:

- ✓ Each article must clearly relate to the relevant issue and allow you to add depth to your discussion
- ✓ All articles must be current no more than 12 months old and Australian
- All articles must be original, sourced and dated and included within the assignment
- All arguments must be supported by facts and wider research and referenced throughout the assignment
- A complete bibliography must accompany assignment
- ✓ Assignment should be no more than 900 words
- Assignment to be presented as a word-processed document, 1.5 spacing and with a 2cm margin
- ✓ Normal penalties for late submission as per the assessment guidelines
